- 1976 Organized as a 501 c 3
- 1976 Tx Dept Health & Human Services medical transportation to Medicaid Recipients
- ▶ 1978 AAA transport elderly persons (over 60 years of age)
- ▶ 1982 Social Security provide Money Management
- 1992 County of El Paso Indigent Guardianship Program

- 2001 County of El Paso Fixed Route Program
- ▶ 2005 to 2010 Housing Authority City of El Paso
- 2006 Job Access Reverse Commute (JARC) and New Freedom Programs.
- 2007 Komen for the Cure low income women to breast cancer treatment centers
- 2008 EPCC transport students to an off-site campus
- 2009 Volunteer Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD)
 to be prepared to respond to emergencies


- 2010 Lead/fiscal agent of the 9th ADRC in the Texas (16 ADRC's, six more to be established in 2013)
- ▶ 2010 to 2012 County Nutrition Centers for EP County
- 2011-MIPPA Contract Awarded
- 2012 Community-based Care Transition Program (CCTP) (first awarded in Texas!)
- 2012 Sun Metro and PA awarded grant to implement Veterans Transportation Community Living Initiative (VTCLI)

- Cost to provide service was \$31.50 / trip
- PA provided transportation through New Freedom in 2010 – 2011
- PA arranged for service using NF grant from TxDOT
 NF @ \$27.50 trip
 County EP \$4.00 trip
- 2011 2012 provided <u>13,694</u> trips to Nutrition Centers to elderly / persons with disabilities
- September 2012 funding ended
