BASIC COUNTY CORRECTIONS: (280 hours) TCLEOSE 1007 This course meets the TCLEOSE and Department Requirements for Basic Jailer License. ** Maximum Level ** Course Dates for BDO 09-3: November 25th through January 15th, 2010.	-	15 Graduation	-
MENTAL HEALTH PEACE OFFICER TRAINING (24 hours) TCLEOSE 4001 <i>This is a Mandatory course for all Sheriff's Office Peace Officers.</i> The purpose of the Mental Health Officer course is to further inform and educate the officer in the area of mental health and issues pertaining to serving as a mental health officer, to include advanced crisis intervention training. Pre-Requisites: Currently appointed as a peace officer or justice of the peace; at least two years experience as a peace officer or justice of the peace; if not currently a commissioned peace officer, an applicant must meet the current enrollment standards; if an applicant is a commissioned peace officer, an applicant must not ever have had a license or certificate issued by the commission suspended or revoked; if an applicant is a commissioned peace officer, an applicant must have met the continuing education requirements for the previous training cycle; successful completion of a training course in emergency first aid and lifesaving techniques (Red Cross or equivalent); and successful completion of the current Mental Health Officer proficiency, with a score of 80% or better. BLACKBOARD TRAINING (ORIENTATION): (10 hours credit) This course is designed as an orientation to On-line Blackboard learning system. The students will cover; E-Training Orientation TCLEOSE 3854 (2 hrs), & TCLEOSE 3939 Cultural Diversity (8 hrs) in the computer lab through the Blackboard learning system with direct instruction from an instructor. INTERMEDIATE ARREST, SEARCH AND SEIZURE: (24 hours) TCLEOSE 2108 This course is a TCLEOSE requirement for Intermediate PEACE OFFICER Certification. Limited to 36 students. Time: 0800-1700	-	20-22	-
INTERMEDIATE ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION: (40 hours) TCLEOSE 2070 This course introduces the officer to basic drawing skills needed for scale diagrams at the scene of a vehicle crash and presents five formulas that can be used to determine the minimum speed of the vehicle based on skid and/or yaw marks to calculate combined speeds. Topics: Why Peace Officers Investigate Collisions, Evidence identification and collection, Scale drawing techniques, Basic minimum speed calculations, and Conducting skid tests. A Portion of the course is conducted outdoors. Requirements: Scientific Calculator, a 100 ft. tape measure, and mechanical or wood pencil(s) with a lead measurement of 0.5mm. BASIC INSTRUCTOR COURSE: (40 hours) TCLEOSE 1014 This course is a requirement for a certification as Texas Law Enforcement Commission Instructor; in addition students must have a License in the State of Texas as a Peace Officer, Telecommunicator or Jailer. Must have Commanders endorsement. To qualify for TCLEOSE Instructor Proficiency must have substantial experience in teaching or in the special field or subject area to be taught, to include; two year's experience as a peace officer, Telecommunicator, or jailer a bachelor's degree and two years of teaching experience; or a graduate degree; successful completion of this course, and submit a completed application (I-1) and required fees. NEW SUPERVISOR'S COURSE: (24 hours) TCLEOSE 3737 This course meets the TCLEOSE Rule §217.11 (c) (3) & Occupation Code Chapter 1701 Sec. 1701.352. (d) requirements for Peace Officers appointed to the Officer's First Supervisory Position, this training must be completed within 24 months following the date of appointment as a supervisor. PPCT IMPACT WEAPON COLLAPSIBLE BATON SYSTEMS RE-CERTIFICATION: (4 hours) TCLEOSE 2053 At the conclusion of this course the officer will be able to justify the use of intermediate weapons, identify motor points in the arms and legs. Student will be able to properly demonstrate all techniques in PPCT Impact Weapon System. Students are required to bring their Duty Belt, Baton and PT Gear. ** Maximum Level Pre-Requisites: Impact Weapon Collapsible Baton Systems Initial Certification. Limited to 20 students. DEFENSIVE DRIVING COURSE (DDC): (6 hours) TCLEOSE 2046 This is the National Training Safety Institute (NTSI) Course for defensive driving, will give the student the required defensive driving skills per NTSI, this course is not for ticket dismissal. The course is open to all Sheriff's Office Employees who operate department motor vehicle. Limited to 20 students. Time: 0800-1500	10	12	09
AED/CPR RE-CERTIFICATION: (4 hours) TCLEOSE 3800 for <i>El Paso County Sheriff's Office Personnel ONLY!</i> This is a Re-certification Course that will review the use of the AED with CPR. Two Sessions per day. Time: 0800-1200 & 1300-1700 Limited to 12 students.	-	08	12
OLEORESIN CAPSICUM (O.C.) SPRAY RE-CERTIFICATION: (4 hours) TCLEOSE 3343 Students will be exposed to a level two or level three contamination after classroom instruction to include use of force policy. Limited to 24 students. Two Sessions. Time: 0800-1200 & 1300-1700	-	-	16
PHYSICAL ASSESSMENT (Option A) or HEALTH & WELLNESS COURSE (Option B): <i>El Paso County Sheriff's Office Licensees ONLY!</i> New Department PT assessment: For officers hired prior to November 2009 - 3 hour Health and Wellness course (Option B TCLEOSE credit 3 hours) may be taken in lieu of PT Assessment (Option A - NO TCLEOSE credit). ** Maximum Level <u>All sworn officers must either attend the course or assess once per year.</u> Limited to 36 students. STATE AND FEDERAL LAW UPDATE COURSE: (2 hours) TCLEOSE 3181 <i>This is a Mandatory course for all Sheriff's Office Peace Officers. TCLEOSE training mandates for Peace Officer for 2009-2011 & 2011-2013 training unit.</i> Required Course Texas Occupations Code 1701.251 (a-1). The goal of this course is to provide law enforcement officers with an update of recently statute changes and addition provided by the 81 st Legislature. Recent Supreme Court decisions that impact important issues such as search and seizure, detention, etc., were also included in this curriculum as these cases may impact the function, policy, and procedures of law enforcement officers and law enforcement administration. PEACE OFFICER ENFORCEMENT OF CHILD CUSTODY AND POSSESSION ORDERS: (2 hours) TCLEOSE 3617 <i>This is a Mandatory course for all Sheriff's Office Peace Officers.</i> This training is intended to provide guidance to the peace officer regarding enforcement of visitation and custody rights. Some of the topics that will be covered include; Enforcing a court order through Crimes Against Children under §25.03 T.P.C., Interference with Child Custody, vs. through the family law courts. New law, §105.006 of the Family Code, which clarifies the immunity of a police officer acting in good faith to enforce the terms of a court order, How do you determine who has the right to possession of a child when there is no court order?, Who counts as a legal father when the parents are not married?, Are agreements between the parents that are contrary to the court order enforceable?, What are the requirements for contempt?, What are valid and invalid reasons for denying visitation?, these are just some of the topics of discussion for this course. ESCORT POSITION AND JOINT LOCK CONTROL: (4 hours) TCLEOSE 2084 <i>El Paso County Sheriff's Office Jailer Licensee Officers Only.</i> The student will properly and efficiently demonstrate the procedures for Escort position, distraction technique, and transport wristlock, straight arm bar takedown and inside takedown. Limited to 36 students. Time: 1300-1700	01 & 16	04 & 20	01 & 17
REPORT WRITING: (8 hours) TCLEOSE 2049 <i>El Paso County Sheriff's Office Jailer Licensee Officers Only.</i> This course is designed for detention officers and detention supervisors. The course covers Texas Penal Code, Criminal and Facility Incident reports and Inmate Rule Violation reports. The course will include instruction on report writing using RMS I-Leads. EMERGENCY PROCEDURES & CHEMICAL AWARENESS FOR DETENTION BUREAU: (8 hours) TCLEOSE 3512 <i>El Paso County Sheriff's Office Jailer Licensee Officers Only.</i> <i>This training is mandatory for all licensed detention personnel.</i> The class will cover use of Scott Air-Paks, Fire Extinguishers and Emergency Policy & Procedures. The historical development of corrections is discussed, along with the goals of criminal sentencing, jails, prisons, alternative sentencing, prisoner rights, rehabilitation, parole and probation, and the future of the U.S. corrections profession.
