ALLOCATION OF ALLOWABLE § 179D FEDERAL ENERGY TAX CREDIT FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO JUVENILE PROBATION DEPARTMENT AND YOUTH SERVICES CENTER

Whereas, on October 27th, 2008, El Paso County Texas entered into a contract (KK-08-247) with Wright and Dalbin Architects, Inc. ("the Architect") which included creating technical specifications for installation of energy efficient improvements to the County's Juvenile Probation Department offices located at 6400 Delta Drive, El Paso Texas, and the County Youth Services Center located at 6314 Delta Drive, El Paso, Texas; and

Whereas the County of El Paso desires to encourage the use of energy-efficient equipment and improvements in its buildings and other facilities;

Whereas the Architect has reported that some of the improvements may qualify for a federal energy tax deduction for energy-efficiency improvements pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 179D, and has requested that the County assign any allocation of any such tax deduction to the Architect; and

Whereas the Internal Revenue Service has advised that a local government or political subdivision may allocate § 179D deductions to the party primarily responsible for designing an energy efficient property; and

Whereas the County of El Paso makes no representation or determination as to any amount, if any, which may be available for such federal energy tax deduction, or that the improvements qualify for any

such tax deduction whatsoever;
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Now, therefore, on July, 2012 the County Commissioners Court of El Paso County Texas,
sitting as the governing body of El Paso County Texas, voted in an open and duly posted meeting to
authorize allocation to Wright and Dalbin Architects, Inc. one-hundred percent (100%) of the §179D
federal energy tax deduction for improvements being made pursuant to the above contract to the
Juvenile Probation Department facility located at 6400 Delta Drive, and the Youth Services Center, 6314
Delta Drive, El Paso Texas in the event the described improvements qualify for any such deduction.
